
Hi all,

If your child has Covid confirmed by a PCR test you must keep your child at home for 10 days, the whole family do not need to self-isolate for 10 days anymore unless they have Covid confirmed or symptoms. It is important for the whole family to arrange a PCR test if a close contact has Covid. This does not affect your child's attendance so you are aware self-isolating is coded separately for reporting to the DFE.

It is important to inform the school on the first day of absence with the type of absence of your child has particularly, if they have Covid symptoms by ringing the welfare option at school or emailing the welfare@roxeth.harrow.sch.uk. Please ensure all family members are carrying out twice weekly LFD tests to keep everyone safe. The South Harrow Covid walk in centre can be accessed for a PCR test for any child or adult with flu like symptoms just pop in or book online.

Please keep taking the twice weekly LFD tests. These can be ordered from the website below or picked up from local chemists. The new type of LFD test is only for a nasal swab now. Please report the results on the NHS website below. PCR tests can also be ordered online see the links below: -



Please request permission in advance if your child is likely to be taking leave of absence from school. Permission will only be granted for compassionate leave in exceptional circumstances such as bereavement of a close family member. This must be requested in advance to Mr Deanus on the form which you can pick up from the School Office. Each case is assessed and so you are aware no authorised leave is permitted if attendance falls below 95% or during 6 SATs year. Any unauthorised leave could incur an Educational Penalty Notice fine £60 per child & each parent. We appreciate your co-operation by not requesting leave of absence at this time. Children have missed 22 weeks of their education through lockdown over the last 18 months. We do understand families have missed out on traveling to see families in their homelands but we have to follow Government guidance on Attendance.


Anti-Bullying Week



STEM WEEK-D&T


D&T subject is an important part of STEM experience. The teachers in Roxeth planned exciting hands-on activities. Each year group had an opportunity to get stuck in the kitchen and cook something from the country they were learning about. The children were also provided with many problem solving opportunities while making models and carrying out projects focusing on saving our planet. 
YEAR 1 STEM Week



During STEM Week the year 1 students explored Peru and learnt about the Inca Empire. The students discovered Inti, the God of the Sun and made sculptures using salt dough. We also investigated water, learning about sinking and floating and how we can save water. The students used recyclable materials to create their own shoe. They planned and constructed them using newspaper, cardboard and tape. The goal was that they were able to put on and take off their show without breaking.



YEAR 2 STEM Week



In Year 2, our focus was on the Great Wall of China. The children fully immersed themselves in the week where each lesson was based around China. In D&T we cooked a Chinese noodle salad which the children thoroughly enjoyed making (and eating!). The children carried out experiments for example which material would be the best to build a wall for Humpty Dumpty. We also made fireworks in a cup, using oil, warm water and lots of different food colouring. Furthermore, we made noodles dance by using vinegar and baking soda. The children thoroughly enjoyed watching and understanding what a chemical reaction is.

YEAR 4 STEM Week




In Year 4 we made Pyramid shaped Rice crispy cakes and pyramids made out of sugar cubes because our topic was all about 'Pyramids'. We also made posters for representing the 5 types enquiry types and we enjoyed conducting an investigation using eggs. We placed eggs in different liquids and over time we observed what happened to the shell.



Stem Week Year 5

Year 5 focused on Chichen Itza in Mexico for the week. We investigated droughts in Mexico and developed our own water irrigation systems to help farmers. We loved using recycled materials to create our own versions of Chichen Itza. We also REALLY loved making quesadillas and eating them too-they were absolutely scrumptious!



YEAR 6 STEM week

As part of our STEM week Y6 researched all about Brazil. This included learning some Portuguese, learning about their main religion, researching the height and scaling problems with Christ the Redeemer and understanding about their carnival celebrations. We even made brigaderios.

On the 4th of November St Anselm's Primary School held an Art Exhibition. A small group of children from Roxeth were lucky to go and see their amazing work. Their art showcase was inspired by artist like Jacqueline Hurley and her Remembrance Day art and abstract portraits by Picasso.
