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Parent Partnership

In 2019, we embarked on a journey to create a stronger bond between Roxeth School and the families it serves. For the Family School Partnership Award process, an initial survey was conducted with the staff and parents. Based on the feedback, three objectives were chosen for completion as a requirement for the FSPA award.



The main priorities that were chosen were based on three aspects of school life:

fostering effective relationships between school and families by developing a family school partnership policy (can be viewed on the school website);
getting all staff on board the concept of parental engagement by providing staff training and insets on dealing with parents and managing expectations and behaviour; and

•giving voice to parents to decide what would they like the school to do for them which was provide adult courses based on skills development in Maths, ICT and Parent Nurturing programme.

A final survey with parents and staff to measure progress was conducted at the end of the spring term 2021. The results show that the change in the baseline is impressive!

After submitting the evidence proving all the work that has been going on in the past couple of years, the FSPA team has granted the Family School Partnership Award to Roxeth School. The award will be presented to the school in a ceremony to be held on the 15th of September 2021. The school is moving in the right direction towards parental involvement and empowerment and will continue to build upon this strength in the coming years.

Reception classes have been learning about Animals.


We explored animal habitats, animal patterns and did some amazing art creating different animals using paint or collage materials. We also learnt about Chicken life cycle.
